



# Let's Learn About Trees!


A tree is a kind of plant.




Plants need soil, sun and water to grow.




Plants help us in many ways. They provide food, shelter and clothing.




Trees are the biggest plants.

Trees have many parts to them.






You can tell trees

year long.




Trees hold the soil in place when it rains  
and keep rivers and lakes cool and clear.




Trees make shade, too.


Trees make the oxygen we breathe, and trees give us fruits and nuts.

made from trees.




Some trees live together  
in forests.




Some trees live alone.

We play, camp and picnic in forests.




Birds and animals play and live in forests, too.




We cut some trees to make wood and paper.




When we cut trees,  
we plant new ones.




We leave some trees  
to enjoy.




Trees face many dangers.




Trees have many friends.




Trees need friends
